Insects present in Town parks, trails, or trees are the responsibility of the Towns Recreation Department.

INSECT PESTS & RATS

Infestations of Insect Pests or Rats as defined in the Agricultural Pest Act will be the responsibility of the Community Standards Officer or other Taber Police Service Member who is an appointed inspector under the Agricultural Pest Act.

Sightings of these Pests will be investigated and control measures will be put in place where necessary.

SKUNKS, RACCOON AND BADGER

These unwanted creatures may be found rummaging around your yard or hiding under your deck.

THE BEST WAY TO KEEP THESE CRITTERS OUT OF YOUR PROPERTY IS TO KEEP YARDS NEAT AND DO NOT FEED THEM!

Remove fallen fruit from trees. Brush and debris should be neatly piled. Sheds, decks and other structures that may attract these animals should be sealed off or raised to discourage denning activity.

Notice/Order(s) to Comply may be issued to properties that appear to be attracting these wild ani-

TRAP LENDING PROGRAM

The Community Standards Unit will be offering a program to assist members of the community with the trapping of nuisance skunks, raccoons or badgers on private property.

The traps will be lent out for a period of two weeks at no cost to the borrower.

The landowner will be responsible for setting, baiting and monitoring the trap.

AFTER CAPTURE

Once the animal has been trapped. The landowner will need to relocate the animal away from Town and any residential areas.

Or

The Community Standards Unit will provide a relocation service for a \$25.00 per animal fee and will remove the animal for you.

The traps will need to be returned cleaned and undamaged by the due date for the next person to use.

DOGS

BE A GOOD PET OWNER...KNOW YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

DOG LICENSES

All dogs over 6 months must wear license tags at all times and have current registration with the Town.

An annual license for a spayed or neutered dog is \$15.00 before September and \$10.00 after September 30th.

Dogs that are not altered are \$30.00 before September 30th and \$20.00 after September 30th.

If you lose your tag a replacement license is \$5.00

It is important to keep our dog file up-to-date. Whether you add a dog, move, or sadly lost one, please update your file.

LEASH LAW

Dogs must be on a leash and under the care and control of a competent person at all times when on public property and contained when on private property. Unless in a designated off leash area.

Dogs found running at large may result in impoundment and the owner is subject to fees and fines.

BARKING DOGS

Owners are not permitted to allow their dogs to bark or howl disturbing the neighbourhood.

PICK UP AFTER YOUR PET

Dog poop is unsightly and unsanitary and poses health hazards to humans and other animals.

Please pick up after your dog and dispose of it appropriately. Failure to do so can result in a \$50.00 fine.

AGGRESSIVE DOGS

An aggressive dog means any dog, regardless of age, whether on public or private land which has:

Caused harm to a person, or without provocation has: chased or threatened a person or other domestic animal, or destroyed or damaged public or private property.

CATS

STRAY/FERAL CATS

The Town of Taber promotes a Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) Program which is lead by a volunteer coordinator.

The purpose of the program is to trap feral/stray cats and have them spayed or neutered. Wild feral cats are then released to live in colonies with other altered cats. Friendlier cats are placed for adoption and found new homes.

If you are having a problem with a large quantity of stray cats in your neighbourhood, contact the Community Standards Unit who will pass on your information to the TNR coordinator who will determine if your area is suitable for trapping in, or if another situation is present causing an increase of the stray population.

DOMESTIC CATS

Keep your cat(s) indoors. Not only is it safer, but it

DO NOT FEED STRAY ANIMALS UNLESS YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR A DESIGNATED FEEDING STATION OR COLONY. FEEDING STRAYS, INVITES MORE TO COME AND PROVIDES THEM A PLACE TO REPRODUCE. THIS ONLY ADDS TO THE HOMELESS CAT POPULATION.

will keep your neighbours happy.

Ensure your cat wears identification. If your cat is accidentally trapped in a TNR trap, an ID will notify the trapper that the cat is not a stray and belongs to someone. Otherwise, your cat may be taken in and eventually placed up for adoption.
